The following represents the collaboration of all of Easton’s teachers, in a series of meetings. Each of the choices below was discussed by all teachers and the schedules were collaborated upon and designed by Easton teachers.

Purposes of meeting:

1. Discussion of grade level **instructors** and **grade level groupings**.
2. Break down of **schedules** for elementary, middle and high school.

Primary areas of focus:

1. What is in the best interest of our students at all levels.
2. Teachers in their areas of expertise as much as possible for less cost to district.
3. A flexibility portion for the plan to accommodate when/if Kindergarten students come on board.
4. Configuration change without the requirement of the ESD/OSPI approval.
5. Building in structured changes of instructors for the middle school grades 7 and 8.
6. Built in intervention teachers and schedule in elementary ELA and Math.
7. Providing an authentic middle school experience with a variety of teachers.

- planned enrollment shared 4/19/2022 at ESSC meeting
- needs of the district/budget
- Concern of all teachers: Standardized testing starts in grade 3; K-2 is primarily developmental in academics and social development, Grade 3 is the initiation from change from developmental to application of learning. The grade level banding of 1,2 and 3 is not in the best interest of our students.
- Concern of all teachers: Training time and the \$ involved in allowing for the 3 days/subject level adds a lot to an already stretched budget.

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by April Simonson at 5:30 PM.

Approve Agenda: Phillip Meehan made a motion to approve tonight's meeting, with the requested change in the agenda. Jen Phillips seconded the motion. The motion passed by a unanimous vote of the board.

Board Minutes: Phillip Meehan made a motion to approve the 04-12-2022 minutes. Chris Helgeson seconded the motion. The motion was approved by a unanimous vote of the board.

Communication to the Board: Mr. Berndt said the communication that was received will be discussed later in the meeting.

Public Comment: None

Reports:

- **Financial** – Business manager, Lindy Wells, discussed the attached budget report with the board. Board chair, April Simonson

expressed a concern about the budget status being low. Ms. Wells explained that the ESD is working with her to review and make any changes to the past inputs. Chris Helgeson made a motion to approve the consent agenda. John Jensen seconded. The motion passed.

- **Student Report:** None
- **Staff Report:** Lyn Cox presented the staff report. Ms. Cox read the information as to the work that the ESSC is working as a district. The report is attached to these minutes.
- **Board Report:** Phillip Meehan and Chris Helgeson shared that 20 kids showed up at the Easton Fire Dept.'s open house. All are excited to learn and participate in the Easton Fire Departments program. The program starts on May 4, 2022
- **Board Business:**

Teaching out of Endorsement – Each year school boards are required to approve any teacher that may be teaching out of their endorsement. Chris Helgeson made a motion and Jen Phillips seconded to accept the list of teachers teaching out of endorsement report. It passed unanimously.

Resolution #463, to implement cost-cutting procedures recommended by the superintendent was introduced. John Jensen made a motion to approve, Jen Phillips seconded the motion. It was approved unanimously by the board of directors.

The district received a waiver stating that the Easton School District does not have to make up the days lost due to weather this school year. It was moved by John Jensen, seconded by Phillip Meehan and passed unanimously to accept the waiver and to use the original school calendar ending school on 6/16/2022.

Melissa Coburn shared a video of the students and chaperones that attended the camp earlier this month. The outdoor education

experience is being proposed as an annual trip for students, if monies are raised by students. Chris Helgeson made a motion to approve the trip as per Policy #2320. Phillip Meehan seconded the motion. The motion passed Unanimously.

Mr. Tim Berndt asked that the possible job posting be removed from the board business.

April Simonson requested the school board discuss the process for nominating a new member at the next workshop meeting.

Meeting Adjourned: Phillip Meehan made a request to adjourn the meeting. Chris Helgeson seconded the motion. The meeting was adjourned at 6:45 pm.
